I am asking for permission to remove two pine trees from the front of my vard

- 1. One ~30 ft tall long needle pine with a circumference of ~62 inches.
- 2. One ~25 ft. tall long needle pine with a circumference of ~32 inches.

The 30 ft pine is ~15 ft. from the house. There is a bulge on the ground at the base of the tree where the root ball has raised a bit due to a slight lean towards the house. The pine is also close to all my wires that come to the house from the pole at the street. It is also close to a large black cherry tree. I have had this pine trimmed over the years but growth exceeds trimming. As pine trees uproot more easily than some other trees, I am concerned about it falling during a storm or hurricane, or due to any build up of ice and snow during the winter.

The smaller pine is growing into the branches of a large village maple tree* that has branches spreading out over my property causing a lot of shage.

These two pine trees cut back on any sun that my yard might get and they do not allow for any grass to grow under them.

Also, the two pines are ~12 ft apart from each other and their lower branches are now meeting. I have a flag pole that is between the two pines that has not been able to be used in years due to the two pines growing out and touching the flag pole. Also, tulips that were planted around the base of the flag pole years ago no longer bloom due to the shade caused by the pines.

If these two pines were cut down, I'd have more light and air in my front yard and the ability to grow grass and flowers, while still having plenty of trees. In addition to the large village maple out front, I have a Japanese maple, a black cherry, another long needle pine in the front. On my west side, I have an ~80 ft. oak and a small short needle pine.

I would be glad to meet at my property with a member of the tree commission so all the details can be seen and discussed.

*can the village have this maple tree trimmed?

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
