Public Hearing on Maplewood Avenue Proposed Parking Restriction February 9, 2021

Comments from Donald P. Marra

Dear Mayor Rossillo and Members of the Board of Trustees:

Thank you for considering the request for a parking restriction on Maplewood Avenue this evening. Please be aware that this request has the unanimous support of the homeowners on Maplewood Avenue. I have lived on Maplewood Avenue for over forty-three years, and many residents now own multiple cars and have limited parking in their driveways. Thus many more vehicles are parked on the street during the day and overnight. It is a narrow street that cannot safely accommodate parking on both sides. While it is an inconvenience to try to navigate a very narrow opening when this does happen, it is a terribly dangerous situation due to the fact an emergency vehicle would not be able to pass through the street, if necessary.

I have informed all the residents of this public hearing tonight and they are all fully supportive.

I would like to thank Chief Guevera, Steve Trezza, the Traffic Committee, and Trustee Cassell for their patience and support of this resolution.

Mayor Rossillo said the proposed local law is to restrict parking on the south side of Maplewood Avenue and there would be no parking on the southern side of Maplewood Avenue for its entire length.

Deputy Mayor Cassell said the Traffic Committee is in favor of this.

Trustee Taylor said there are a number of areas in the Village that have the same issue. Trustee Taylor said he has spoken to Mr. Manley as Village Administrator and Police Chief Guevara about it.

Mr. Stephen Trezza/DPW General Foreman said this will make it easier for emergency vehicles to get through.

Ms. Dorman/DPW Senior Office Assistant said the snow removal will be easier. Ms. Dorman said they are putting together a list of other areas in the Village that have the same issue.

### **RESOLUTION 4-2021**

RESOLUTION OF THE VILLAGE OF DOBBS FERRY BOARD OF TRUSTEES ADOPTING LOCAL LAW 1-2021 AMENDMENT TO THE VILLAGE OF DOBBS FERRY CODE TO RESTRICT ON-STREET PARKING TO ONE SIDE OF MAPLEWOOD AVENUE

WHEREAS, upon recommendation of the Chief of Police, the Board of Trustees of the Village of Dobbs Ferry has been considering adoption of Introductory Local Law 1-2021 which proposes to restrict on-street parking to only one side of the street for the length of Maplewood Avenue in the interest of public safety; and

WHEREAS, for the purpose of receiving comment on said proposed local law the Board of Trustees conducted a duly noticed public hearing on February 9, 2021 meeting all requirements of all COVID-related Executive Orders of Governor Cuomo during which the public had the opportunity to be heard; and

WHEREAS, the matter was the topic of further discussion and deliberation by the Board at the public meeting on the same evening after the close of the hearing, following which the Board determined there were no impediments to proceeding with adoption of the local law.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Dobbs Ferry hereby adopts Local Law 1-2021 revising Dobbs Ferry Village Code Section 290-28 "On-Street Parking Restrictions" to prohibit on-street parking on the southern side of Maplewood Avenue for its entire length; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Village Board directs the Village Clerk to file and distribute said Local Law No. 1-2021 in accordance with applicable law.

### **LOCAL LAW NO. 1-2021**

"Amendment to the Village of Dobbs Ferry Code to Restrict On-Street Parking along the Length of Maplewood Avenue to One Side Only"

A LOCAL LAW amending Chapter 290 "Vehicles and Traffic" of the Code of the Village of Dobbs Ferry.

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Dobbs Ferry, as follows:

**Section 1.** <u>Legislative Intent</u>. The purpose of this local law is to promote the public health, safety and welfare of the Village of Dobbs Ferry, its residents and visitors by promoting the safe shared use of public streets by restricting on-street parking to a single side of Maplewood Avenue.

**Section 2**. Chapter 290-28 of the Code of Dobbs Ferry "On Street Parking Restrictions" is hereby revised with the addition of new matter to the existing alphabetical list of streets as <u>underlined</u>:

Parking shall be restricted on the following streets as specified:

### Maplewood Avenue

A. No parking on the southern side of Maplewood Avenue for its entire length.

**Section 3.** Except as otherwise provided herein, all other provisions of Chapter 290 shall remain unchanged.

**Section 4**. This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon publication, filing and posting as required by law.

A discussion was held and Ms. Garrison, Mr. Chuhta and Ms. Matthew addressed questions from the Board.

Mayor Rossillo asked how much money was in the Recreation Fund. Mr. Chuhta said as of today there is approximately \$161,000.00 in the Recreation Fund.

Ms. Disan Davis/Playground Fundraising Committee and Maple Street resident said she has reached out to mostly businesses and there is a lot of support from smaller businesses and residents. Ms. Davis said money has been raised from a lot of people, giving different amounts from one dollar and up.

Ms. Matthew said there is not an option to get more CDGB for this project. Ms. Matthew said there is another CDBG round is coming up and the match is always 50%. Ms. Matthew said she is trying to think of how we can segment the project to make a second project out of it, but she can't think of how, because we were pretty detailed in our application, so she is not sure that we can break off a piece and claim it was a new project.

The discussion continued.

# Ms. Fiona Matthew/Grant Writer and Mr. George Pommer/Village Consulting Engineer Update on the Main Street Sidewalks project and additional available funding

Ms. Fiona Matthew/Grant Writer and Mr. George Pommer/Village's Consulting Engineer were present.

Ms. Matthew discussed the Main Street Sidewalks project and additional available funding.

Mr. Pommer discussed the project design and said it is ADA compliant. Mr. Pommer said the plans are set to go again, and they would have to change the dates and go out to bid again.

A discussion was held and Ms. Matthew and Mr. Pommer addressed questions from the Board.

Ms. Matthew described what the course of the construction would be. Ms. Matthew said the project is estimated to take nine months. Ms. Matthew said there is a concern about the impact on the businesses on Main Street.

The Board discussed how this would impact businesses on Main Street.

Ms. Matthew, Mr. Pommer and Mr. Leins addressed questions from the Board.

Ms. Dickson noted that we also have the project coming at 41 Cedar Street and there is potential that they will also be seeking extension of the site plan approval.

The discussion on the impact on businesses continued.

Ms. Fasman asked if we have to pass a resolution at the next meeting to accept the funds. Ms. Matthew said she is going to talk to the NYSDOT and see what they recommend.

Mr. Chuhta said the balance of local funding has to be planned out. Mr. Chuhta said we can't just necessarily come up with \$200,000.00. Mr. Chuhta said he has transferred some capital money over to cover the local portion of this at the time it was approved.

Mr. Leins said we can talk about it.

Mayor Rossillo thanked Ms. Matthew and Mr. Pommer and said we will look at it in September.


