

Address listers in your neighborhood.

Help the U.S. Census Bureau count everyone in the right place.

> Address listers help shape the future through data collection.

Address listers, also known as canvassers, play a critical role in preparing for the 2020 Census. From August to mid-October 2019, listers will be verifying addresses and walking in neighborhoods nationwide.

Address listers are members of your community.

Listers are hired locally. About 40,000 listers are being hired for this major field operation.

> How to recognize an address lister.

Listers must present their ID badge which includes their photograph, a U.S. Department of Commerce watermark, and an expiration date. They may also carry a Census Bureau laptop and a bag with the Census Bureau logo. If you have any questions about address listers, please contact the regional census center in your area at

Address listers keep your data safe and secure.

Listers are vetted through a process just like every other census worker. Each applicant offered a position must go through a thorough background check which includes fingerprinting.

All Census Bureau employees are required to follow strict guidelines and confidentiality laws. This includes taking a lifetime oath to protect the confidentiality of data they receive. Anyone who violates this oath is subject to as much as \$250,000 in fines and up to five years in prison.
