BOARD OF TRUSTEES UPDATES



At the April 26 Board of Trustees meeting the following issues were resolved:

BUDGET

This Village passed the budget for fiscal year 2022-23. Once again we were within the state mandated tax cap and had one of the lowest tax rates in the Rivertowns. [VIEW THE ADOPTED 2022-2023 BUDGET HERE](#)

AMENDED THE VILLAGE'S TREE LAWS

The Board addressed the removal and replacement of trees throughout the Village, by amending the tree laws. We believe the new rules will protect trees by making it harder to remove trees for the wrong reasons and requiring the planting of replacement trees.

MAIN STREET SIDEWALKS

As part of the Main Street sidewalk project, the Village Trustees voted to expand the project by burying the Altice cable lines. Although the cost to bury all the lines is prohibitive, the Board believed that it made sense financially and aesthetically to take the first step and bury the Altice lines. We expect the project to start sometime in June.

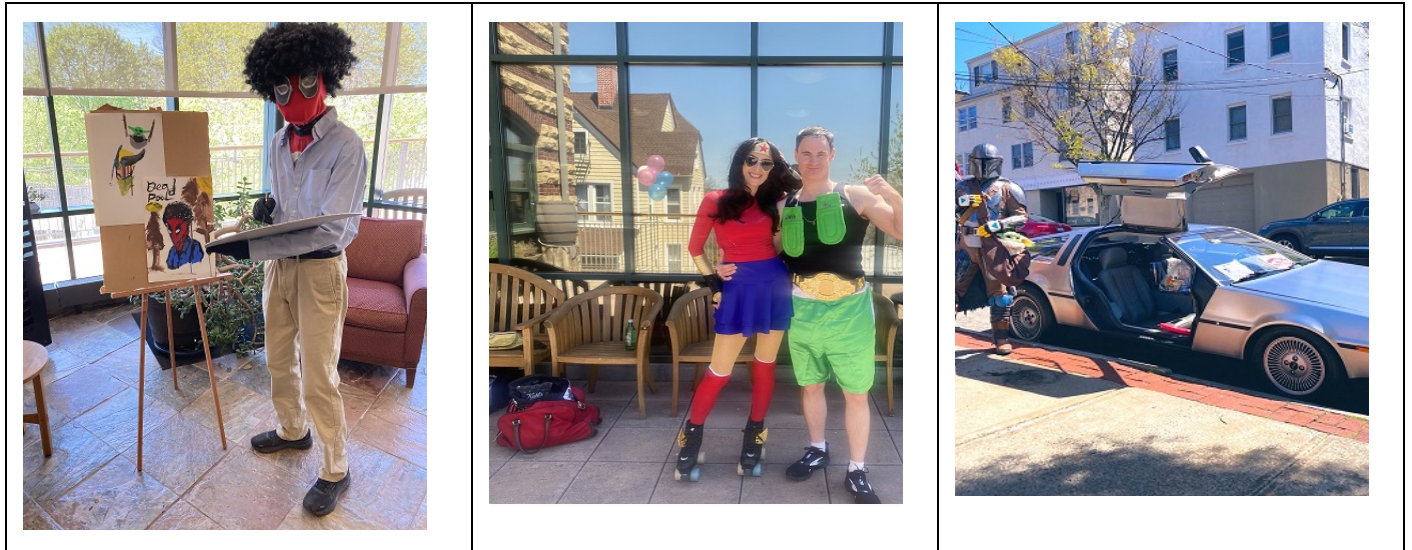
Reminder:

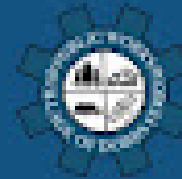
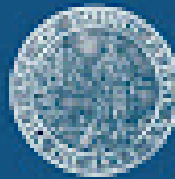
