About ESCOs (Energy Service Companies)

The New York State Public Service Commission (PSC) opened the State's electric and natural gas industries to competition in the last '90s. Changes in both of these markets have provided an opportunity for consumers to choose their supplier of electricity and/or natural gas.

What Is "Slamming"?

Many consumers reported being "slammed" by an ESCO, that is, being switched to an ESCO without their authorization. ESCO representatives - - including telemarketers and door-to-door salespersons - - sometimes claim to be working for the local utility. They offer special deals, and ask to verify the customer's account number. Armed with the account number, the ESCO then notifies the local utility that the customer has authorized the switch.
